With school back in session and most vacations over, we are getting back to normal with events being scheduled and more demands for speaking engagements and such.

We had a great Military Order of Purple Heart ceremony on August 10 and honored seven veterans with bricks in the plaza, plaques from Florida Senator Mayfeild and US Representative Haridopolos along with many other Tchotchkes. Quilts of Valor were also presented by Karmel Sowers and her organization.

The Military Officers Association of America Cape Canaveral held our annual picnic at the BVMC, used the grill outside, and fed 52 members of MOAACC and 32 members of the Sea Cadets and parents. MOAACC also presented the Courageous Division with a check for \$1500 to help with expenses in support of the Sea Cadets. Pictures will be in the Courier covering this event.

Space Coast Daily will be having one of their expos at the Center tomorrow, August 20 with an expected attendance of 200-300 people. Around twenty vendors are expected in the Gray Hall with nine more in the Museum. The Red Cross food truck will provide lunch for everyone, and we hope for a successful event.

The air conditioning unit has been out in the Gray Hall, but the county has installed two portable units that are working as hard as possible to combat the oppressive heat we have been experiencing.

The Space Coast Office or Tourism Visitor Information Center has invited us to have a 60 day static display of what the Brevard Veterans Memorial Center, Museum, Library, Plaza, and Park has to offer to the public. The visitor center is located at 267 W Cocoa Beach Cswy (SR 520). It is in a strip mall across from the Dinosaur Store and Museum in Cocoa Beach. This will be our chance to let the public know of the hidden gem of Merritt Island and Brevard County. We will set up the display the first week of September.

The Amphitheater and the other building which houses the restrooms and concession stand have really taken shape. The grading for the new road into the park from Fortenberry is in work as well as additional parking places. We are close to having water again in the park pavilion restrooms. Roger Scruggs continues to photograph and post the pictures as it is being built.

All three of our "senior" services are celebrating their 250th anniversaries this year with several different ceremonies. The Coast Guard celebrated its 235th anniversary on August 4th with an open house at the USCG station. The Army celebrated its 250th with the Navy and Marine Corps milestones coming up in October and November. The Air Force celebrated their 77th anniversary on September 18 and the Space Force will be 6 years old in December 2025.

VMC Librarian Report

In July 2025 (the most recent month for which data is available), the library hosted 226 visitors.

Over the past month, the library team has received an influx of donated books, which have been carefully examined. Once accepted, each book has been cataloged, labeled and placed on the shelf. What we can't use goes to the "Free Books" cart.

So far this year, our team has conducted four VHP interviews. Post-production is complete. We are in touch with several other prospects. These interviews become part of the American Folklore Project at the Library of Congress. Hopefully, future generations will be able to experience these interviews by video (or possibly some other technology yet to be invented) and rather than being dry entries in school books, the experiences of our veterans will be a living legacy to generations of Americans yet unborn.

In September, we will resume our last Tuesday night discussion group. Since October marks the 250th anniversary of the U.S. Navy, on September 30 a Navy veteran will conduct a presentation. At least six locations in the United States claim to be the birthplace of the U.S. Navy. We will discuss the case for and case against each claim, and hopefully learn about the origins of America's guardian on the seas.

Non Sibi Sed Patria --- "Not for self but for country."

Book of the Month: "War As I Knew It" by General George S. Patton

Just as General George Patton stands out as a unique character in American military history, so *War As I Knew It* is an unusual book, consisting of three discordant sections. It is less a narrative than an outline or a draft of a book that was never completed due to General Patton's untimely death shortly after the conclusion of World War Two. The present book was compiled by the General's widow, Beatrice, and Lieutenant Colonel (later General) Paul Harkins, Deputy Chief of Staff to Patton (and later commander of U.S. forces in Vietnam from 1962-1964).

The first section, based on letters to Beatrice, covers the campaigns in North Africa and Sicily. A disproportionate share of this section is allotted to describing ceremonies involving the King of Morocco (a U.S. ally), Vichy French officials (enemies turned allies), and of local architecture. The second section, by far the largest, details the battles and campaigns of the Third Army from August 1944 to the end of the war, including the counterattack to relieve Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge. General Patton's description of his deployment of Corps and Divisions in an unrelenting advance reads like a chess grandmaster's account of crushing a worthy opponent. Unless one has a detailed understanding of European geography, however, at times the narrative is difficult to follow. The accompanying maps are helpful but only to a degree.

This section is peppered with General Patton's choice aphorisms: "A pint of sweat saves a gallon of blood" (his own), "In every battle there comes a time when both sides consider themselves beaten; then he who continues the attack wins" (General U.S. Grant) and the often-repeated "Do not take council of your fears" (General Stonewall Jackson). He also does not miss an opportunity to criticize his nemesis from the Sicily campaign, British General Montgomery. The first chapter of the third section is a series of reflections and suggestions that resembles Sun Tzu's *Art of War*. The second chapter is a synopsis of 34 incidents in General Patton's career from West Point to the end of his command of Third Army where he illustrates his philosophy. Among the highpoints: In 1914, then-Second Lieutenant Patton protected an African-American soldier falsely accused of rape from a lynch mob in Kansas; and in 1943, his actions to restore confidence among the II Corps after the defeat at Kasserine Pass (Tunisia) under a previous commander, so these same soldiers were victorious at El Guetter within two weeks.

War As I Knew It is recommended for students of General Patton or of the Third Army. The third section, "Retrospect," is of greatest interest to the general reader. *War As I Knew It* (1975 reprint) is found in the VMC library as "Bio-Patt-01."

Orders picked up with the new Park opening soon (with four being delivered in August), including one requested by local fishermen who come almost every day to fish off our walkway behind the Gray Hall. That bench will stay out in that area to be enjoyed by all.

TREES

Only one new Memorial Tree was requested but we had lots of inquiries about when the 27 already paid for would be planted. Right now, it planned to begin in mid-September.



Remember Victory Over Japan (V-J) Day — 80 Years Later

On 14 August 2025 the Veterans Administration held Ceremonies at every VA/NCA Cemetery in the country to remember a very important date in American military history — the surrender by Japan 80 years earlier to end WWII. About 40 people attended the event at Cape Canaveral National Cemetery (CCNC) that began early on a usual warm morning. Cindy VanBibber shared moving comments about the war's end and the huge impact that day had on millions of veterans who knew they were headed home, while over 400,000 of their buddies did not.

VanBibber also made reference to the solid obligation of our country and the VA to keep veteran history alive as she listed many of the key battles of the Second World War. Among the over 19,000 veterans and spouses now laying in honored rest at CCNC (as of 31 July) 2,157 of them are WWII veterans. Their number includes one Tuskegee Airman and his spouse who were re-buried at CCNC during a moving 2019 ceremony.

The North Brevard Color Guard rendered the 21-Gun Salute after a symbolic wreath was laid by an amazing Brevard County Resident, Cam Pelletier, now 103 years old. Cam Pelletier was a Navy SeaBee who served in combat during three major island campaigns in the South Pacific. His job was to help build airstrips and fighting positions for American aircraft and troops as they moved closer and closer to the Japanese main islands. Pastor Jerry Hanson led prayers for the fallen and wounded, but also for the decision of surrender which likely saved hundreds of thousands more lives. The beautiful Caisson shared by Tom and Denise Fitzgerald was flag draped and in place to honor all WWII veterans then and now.

The WWII V-J Day Ceremony is held every five years by all VA Cemeteries. Those who attended hoped they would make the next one and many more would attend as well.

JROTC Gets Big Boost from BVMC, MOAACC, ECAC and Others to Start 2025-26 School Year

During a half-day meeting at the Brevard Veterans Memorial Center (BVMC) Museum on 06 August, the community joined in providing support to all 4 Brevard County JROTC Units. Classes start next Monday for the 7 Army, 3 Air Force, 2 Navy, 1 Marines and 1 Space Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps programs. The JROTC Instructors got a leg up in getting funds, completing event schedules, learning about BPS, Good Deeds Foundation (GDF) and Education and Citizenship Armed Forces Coalition of the Space Coast (ECAC) as well as Service recruiters and others support.

Dean Schaaf, President of BVMC, briefed on the status of the \$8.2 M BVMC Park Amphitheater and related Park upgrades, which will support numerous JROTC events starting in late September. He also encouraged museum tours, service projects and support to major events like 9/11 Remembrance, Last Naval Battle of the Revolution, Veterans and Memorial Day events at the BVMC and Park. MOAACC's Treasurer, RADM Wayne Justice, USCG, Ret and GDF President Donn Weaver spoke about plans to support JROTC with major cash grants (\$42,000 total), purchasing all trophies, ribbons and medal (\$20K for 15 major events), special JROTC projects during the year, and possibly another cash infusion for the second semester. MOAACC's Student Affairs Committee including Dan Wilson, Hans Hunt, Mike Broski and Scott Waggoner, spoke about special events, awards, service hour options and much more.

BPS Superintendent Mark Rendell made a surprise visit to encourage the JROTC Instructors with their important missions for the year ahead and to announce a new program. With the help of the veteran community, he will support a unique Challenge Coin program for every JROTC school to award stellar cadets and all seniors who serve two or more years as cadets when they graduate. That would become their "first" official military challenge coin. Some will get another if they choose to join any military branch next year at the Ceremony noted below.

Led by Matt Susin, Brevard Public Schools Board Member, an ECAC team with Yvette Cruz (BPS Community Relations), Tammy and Maj Gen Dwyer, USAF, Ret, briefed about the new ECAC website. It offers access to students, parents, teachers, JROTC Instructors and guidance counselors to all options for scholarships, training and awards related to the military. This includes getting into the Academies, ROTC College Scholarships, delayed enlistment training programs and working with the Museums of Brevard to enhance student visits and knowledge about the military and veterans. They confirmed the plan to host a second annual BPS/ECAC Space Coast Military Services Enlistment Ceremony in late April 2026 at the new BVMC Amphitheater and Park is in the works.

By the end of the morning, the JROTC Instructors departed with more capabilities and were better aware of how much our community and BPS support them as they begin another year working with likely over 2500 JROTC cadets in Brevard.
