Donations Mount in the Memorial Plaza and our Improved Park Attracts new Business

June saw a steady uptick with 24 Donations for new bricks, including 12 to be installed after the Military Order of Purple Heart's 08 August Purple Heart Day Ceremony. We also received two new orders for the large white bench tops in the Plaza which makes three in two months for at total of \$4000 ink donations. The 2020-21 Plaza upgrade was completed in June and it is looking better than ever. Again, thanks to CSpray and Chad and Kitty Stoudt for making our plaza a project of there heart as well as their business. They have been with us since the beginning in 2009.

The Park survived the four day Memorial Day Weekend with 3-4000 people and is already being readied for the Great American Blast after the Static Parade on 03 July. Both events include fliers in this edition of the Courier. We expect several Scout Campouts this summer and a big event in the Park as well as at VMC event area for the 20th Anniversary of the attack on 9/11 on 11 Sep. We have been meeting with MIRA and County Officials in June to continue Park improvements (about \$1M) leading up to the construction of our \$2.3 M Amphitheater later this year or early next.

We are working also with the County and River Rats on a revised and improved location for the Medal of Honor Tribute in the VMP.

We searching for a stand alone Park Committee which will help plan, schedule, upkeep and find raise via the expanding interest in using the Veterans Memorial Park. Also, Look for our new signs advertising our Memorial Brick, Trees and outdoor Benches in the Plaza and Park.

Shields of Honor: The Exciting Life of a Naval Reservist.

In my earliest days of military experience-- the military experience was all new except for the WWII tales from my father and other relatives...OH! And the 16 MM war movies in High School ROTC. However in 1952 the Birmingham AL USNR Fleet Air Service Squadron (FASRON -681) could use another 18 year old ordnance person and I volunteered with my school chums. They said reservist life is exciting and we wear these neat uniforms....we also get paid real money....the work is better than cutting grass.

My first exposure to active duty was Moffett Field, San Francisco, CA. Dry and dusty. Chow line food was some of the best ever...As reservist we were given a "chit" for the meal which was presented to the end of the line-no cost. I was educated in two aspects of this wonderful meal...first I did not have to pay. Secondly, the sailor next in line had to pay about fifty cents. I ask why he paid and I did not. "Brown bagger" was a new expression ... it was obviously a paper brown bag. The sailor who had to pay said he was a "Brown Bagging Station Keeper on active duty". He did not much appreciate reservist coming in and disturbing the status quo. I found quickly that active duty were jealous of our whole squadron but we minded our own business, flew our missions and dropped our (practice) bombs. The main takeaway was jealously of reservists....probably of National Guard also.)

This BVC book is authored by CDR Jack Sullivan ---. I read it twice...book was written by Sullivan-a reservistand given/inscribed to BVC member Tank Sherman. Tank is an old golfing buddy of mine and friend of Sullivan. Sullivan has the same name as the 1930's Boxer and later another same named Secretary of the Navy. Sullivan was a RESERVIST who never became regular Navy...but his career had enough adventures that it does not matter as he wore the same uniform, flew the same planes and took the same risks as any other pilot.

Sullivan was almost a priest and a few months from taking his vows as the WWII was ending. His patriotic call to duty was stronger than the religious vocation and he volunteered as a Naval flight cadet. He wound up in WWII, fighter pilot flight qualified but no war or active duty assignment. He was released and found work as a New York detective. He was recalled as a pilot for Korea and finally again during the Cuban Missile crisis. In his military sabbatical he maintained reserve pilot flight status as he concurrently worked for the New York police detectives. Trust me, any reservist can tell you it is a real balancing act to keep

(One year I worked a regular NASA engineering job plus another 1000 hours of reserve duty as aircraft back seat Intel intercept operator and as security manager for the 200 member 138th Aviation Intel unit in Orlando).

During Vietnam, Sullivan was maintenance manager at Subic Bay in the Philippines. His expertise of supervising the maintenance of the C2 (COD) became legendary and served him well after Navy retirement. After he retired from the Navy he was hired by Grumman Aerospace and supported the Iranian military as Khomeini became a rising militant renegade. Sullivan arranged to get his Grumman employees out of the grasp of the coup. After Iran he was promoted to Base Manager at Vandenberg AFB and supported a variety of aircraft. He retired finally in the Virginia area for a life of golf (six holes in one and a single digit handicap).

Neil Hosler McElroy was secretary of defense under President Eisenhower from October 9, 1957, to December 1, 1959. Prior to his appointment to the cabinet, McElroy's only political experience was in chairing a White House conference on education in 1955. McElroy graduated from Harvard in 1925 as an economics major and began work in the advertising department of Procter and Gamble. He became manager of Procter and Gamble's promotion department in 1929, established a new branch in England in 1930, was made advertising and promotion manager in 1940, became vice president of advertising and promotion in 1943, and finally rose to become president of the company in 1948.

Sea Cadet Award Ceremony



If followed, the ruling could have required the exhumation of all of Arlington's dead, but instead Lee's son officially sold the property to Congress for \$150,000 in 1883.
