1. M-1917 U.S. Steel Helmet with reproduction liner & chinstrap
2. U.S. Overseas Cap with Aviation insignia
3. USMC Campaign Hat with reproduction insignia
4. U.S. Dog Tags, two each with cord "Carl Burgwaldt"
5. U.S. Gas Mask and Carrier (Bag)
6. U.S. M-1910 Field Pack with Ammo Belt, First Aid Pouch, Canteen and Cover
7. U.S. M-1910 Entrenching Shovel
8. U.S. Service Uniform Coat, Wool, Collar Insignia U.S. and Field Artillery, Company C. Two Stripes on right sleeve indicates a Corporal's Rank (Right sleeve only rank 1918 – 1921)
9. U.S. Service Uniform Breeches, wool, enlisted
10. U.S. Puttees, two each wool, (to protect the lower legs)
11. U.S. 1918 Mess Kit with 1917 knife marked A Company, 1918 Fork, and 1918 Spoon
12. U.S. Model 1916 metal Ration Container
13. U.S. Condiment Can, Salt & Pepper, etc.
14. Imperial German M1889 NCO Ammo pouch for the Kar.88 or Gew.88 carbine and rifle respectively. Maker marked "Sattler-Innung (Saddlers Guild) 1916, Barmen". Clip guide inserts in the pouch to hold 3 clips, holds 15 rounds.
15. U.S. 1917 Officer's Shaving Kit with Disposable Blade Packet (empty), Razor, Metal Mirror, Shaving Brush and Tin for Shaving Soap
16. Sewing Kit, called a "Housewife, with buttons. Originally would have had different color thread, needles and patching materials
