The library has been busy cataloging book donations lately. We have received several new titles for our Black Ops, and War on Terror sections. Black Ops includes books on CIA, Navy Seals, and Army Ranger Special Operations. Our War on Terror section includes books on the Afghanistan and Gulf Wars.

Here's a look at the new volumes you can find in the VMC library. Stop by and check one out for yourself!

Of Spies and Lies, catalog number BlackOps-96, is written by CIA lie detection expert John F. Sullivan. He remembers Vietnam and his lie detection duties during the Vietnam War.

The Operator, catalog number BlackOps-96 by Robert O'Neil, tells his story as a Navy Seal Special Operator. "Firing the shots that Killed Osama Bin Laden and my years as a Seal Team Warrior." **The Warrior Elite**, catalog number BlackOps-127, tells the forging of Seal Class 228. Following the trainees of Class 228 as they undergo Basic Underwater Demolition/Seal Training, we learn who these men are, where they come from and what makes them so special.

Warrior Soul: The Memoir of a Navy Seal, catalog number BlackOps-95, by Chuck Pfarrer recounts the author's most dangerous assignments as a Navy Seal.

Rage Company: A Marine's Baptism

Filled with on-theground details and insights on military operations and strategy, Rage Company cements the accurate history of the unlikely alliance that redirected the Iraq War and set the course for operations in the future.

Book Report: A SHAU VALOR - American Combat Operations in the Valley of Death 1963- 1971 by Thomas Yarborough



This is the first book to study the entire nine-year Vietnam campaign, within the context of historical, military, political and cultural events.

The A Shau Valley was the crucial frontier valley, and the 15-mile radius around it was the deadliest killing ground of the entire Vietnam War. The trained professionals of the North Vietnamese and United States armies repeatedly fought each other head-tohead at this location.

From major operations involving battalions of US Army and Marine units to small Special Forces reconnaissance teams, this book has it all. It tells primarily about the actions of the recipients of major awards, with discussion of the planning and politics that involved the service members who fought and died in this horrendous environment.

A special credit to my friend John Ciummo, USMC, who, with his trained service dog, was on point patrol several times in the A Shau Valley. He provided me a copy and encouragement on reading this book about events long since forgotten.

Stories of Sacrifice: Memorial Day at the VMC

The VMC Memorial Day program is one of our most important all year. It tells the story of the ultimate sacrifices of individuals who fell as a result of military service. Over 400 gathered this year to hear speakers tell the legacy of service men and women.

Sheriff Ivey spoke about what those who fell could not do so the rest of us can; Rep Bill Posey presented Merchant Marine WWII CAPT Ed Lanni the 2020 approved Congressional Gold Medal for United States Merchant Marines who served then: twenty Ruck Marchers arrived on time from Cocoa carrying the names of fallen soldiers on a pack laden march; and all reflected on the meaning and need for Memorial Day.

Steps Closer: New Memorial Ground Breaking

A long overdue monument to allied foriegn fighters in American missions begins construction at the Veterans Memorial Center with support from the Vietnam Unforgettable Memories Foundation.

About 50 people gathered on a warm afternoon on 30 April to witness history: the groundbreaking ceremony to create a "Monument to America's Fallen Allies."

As best the Brevard Veterans Memorial Center can determine, there is no other monument or memorial in Florida like the one being built. The enw momument strictly honors the fallen soldiers from foreign, but allied countries who gave their lives for their own nations AND for the mission shared with the United States. Our country has relied on allies who have sacrificed since the French came to our aid during Revolutionary War.

For more than eight years a 501(c)3 organization based in Orlando, the Vietnam Unforgettable Memories Foundation (VUMF) has sought a place in Central Florida to establish such a memorial. In December 2021, the Veterans Memorial Center and Brevard County Officials approved the VMC Memorial Plaza area as the site that would honor Fallen Allies who fought along side American forces throughout history, and would begin with those who fell during the Vietnam War.

Already families from Afghanistan, Canada, and even the Ukraine have expressed interest. These families have relocated to Florida and in many cases have no way to go back to their native countries or no appropriate memorial to visit in their home country.

The ceremony was attended by most of the contractors involved in construction, many members of Rolling Thunder FL Chapter and the VMC and Orlando based supporters of the project. Plans now include starting ground preparation in mid-July and construction by early August.

See the photo on this page is for concept design, which will include over 300 bricks to be engraved honoring those who fell in combat alongside their American brothers and sisters in conflict, no matter when.

The gray granite engraved obelisk with a beautiful metal and protected globe on top will stand over 7 feet high and weigh over 5,000 pounds. The

target for unveiling is 17 September, a key date in the history of American involvement in Vietnam and appropriate during this time of honoring American Vietnam Veterans.

The new monument will be located next to the Immortal Four and All Chaplains Monument to the north of our tank in the Plaza area.
