April was another busy month with many events at the VMC, occasionally maxing out our rental spaces, forcing us to use the Museum for meetings. That is good for the organization to be so popular as a destination for events and meetings! It will only get better and busier.

The County has been making progress in the Park with additional improvements. Next to the new playground, contractors have installed an adult exercise area on a concrete slab which will also have a cover to keep out the hot sun. The equipment is by a company called ENERGI, which provides a total body fitness system with different exercise options.

I represented the VMC and other Veterans organizations at many meetings this month. As an Eagle Scout, I felt obligated to attend the annual fundraiser for the Boy Scouts, the Golden Eagle Dinner. Over \$100,000 was raised for the Scouts. I was invited to the Naval Ordnance Test Unit's (NOTU) Submarine Ball. Ed Pingston, our Museum Curator, provided a Klaxon from the museum collection for use during the ball and boy did they use it. The Klaxon is from the diesel submarine USS Hardhead SS-365, commissioned in 1943. The Propeller Club hosted a ShrimpFeast at Terminal 5 at the Port. It was the main fundraiser for the Propeller Club and was entertaining and raised a "boat load" of money for the organization.

We had Boy Scout troops camp out in our Park for two days and they graciously completed a service project of cleaning out one of our areas of weeds and trees and spruced the area up with mulch. Due to scheduling, the Cocoa Beach Chamber of Commerce Military Affairs Council (MAC) had to hold their monthly meeting in our Museum. It was a successful event and we impressed many in attendance with our displays with promises to return with family and friends.

My wife Susan and I were honored to be featured in Florida Senator Debbie Mayfield's "Mayfield's Minute" information publication as Constituents of the Week.

Stand by for a busy month in May with our Armed Forces Day event in partnership with the Cocoa Beach Regional Chamber of Commerce (more details in the future) and several Memorial Day commemorations.

Thanks for all the volunteers' efforts in making this Veterans Center one of the finest parks in the county. I would especially like to thank the Museum crew and Docents for managing many school tours this last month.

Chaplain's Corner by Chaplain Chip Hanson USMC (Fmr)



Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States, for remembering 1,498,240 men and women who died and the 85,122 who are still missing in action while serving in our Country's Armed Forces. The holiday, which is currently observed every year on the last Monday of May, this year, will be held on May 29, 2023.

Memorial Day is not to be confused with Veterans Day; Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving, whereas Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans Army, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard, Air Force, and now the Space Force. Merchant Marines are not included as part of the US military and why they are not recognized on a Veteran holiday. (ref CITREP, Wikipedia, and several other publications).

Memorial Day was originally held on May 30 from 1868 to 1970 and marks the unofficial start of the summer season.

In 1868, General John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans founded in Decatur, Illinois, established Decoration Day as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the Union war dead with flowers. By the 20th century, various Union and Confederate memorial traditions, celebrated on different days, merged, and Memorial Day eventually extended to honor all Americans who died while in military service.

In 1915, following the Second Battle of Ypres, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, a physician with the Canadian Expeditionary Force, wrote the poem, "In Flanders Fields." Its opening lines refer to the fields of poppies that grew among the soldiers' graves in Flanders.

In 1918, inspired by the poem, YWCA worker Moina Michael attended a YWCA Overseas War Secretaries' conference wearing a silk poppy pinned to her coat and distributed over two dozen more to others present. In 1920, the National American Legion adopted it as their official symbol of

remembrance.

On May 26, 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson designated an "official" birthplace of the holiday by signing the presidential proclamation naming Waterloo, New York, as the holder of the title. This action followed House Concurrent Resolution 587, in which the 89th Congress had officially recognized that the patriotic tradition of observing Memorial Day had begun one hundred years prior in Waterloo, New York. The village credits druggist Henry C. Welles and county clerk John B. Murray as the founders of the holiday. Snopes and Live Science discredit the Waterloo account. (*REF: Wikipedia*)


"I thank Lt. Col. Woodhouse; his words deserve to be emblazoned on a billboard and in all our military bases-indeed, all over the nation."

Book Report

John Adams by David McCullough, Catalog #Bio-Adam-01 Report by Raymond Norman



Author McCullough

McCullough's book is an interesting compendium of facts and historical narrative of the life of

John Adams, the second president of the United States. Adams made the life he was given count, spending his helping to found our country. We may take for granted our current way of life, but things were pretty tough as the nation developed.

John Adams, born in 1735, married Abigail Smith in 1764; she was mainstay and backstop for their lives. Together, they had children Abigail, John Quincy--the sixth president, Susanna, Charles Adams and Thomas Boylston.

After gaining independence in 1776, the United States went to war with Great Britain (again) in 1812 over freedom of the seas. Either privateers or English war ships would attack American vessels, rob the cargo and "impress" the sailors--basically kidnapping the sailors and make them work on the British ships. The US was in the right. For two years, we held off the British, even though we were still a rather weak country. Great Britain was in a life and death struggle with France led by Napoleon. Just as the United States declared war, Napoleon marched off to invade Russia. If he won, as everyone expected, he would control Europe. That is another story.

McCullough leads us through Adams life in 651 pages, twelve chapters with appendices and maps, plus notes. Much of the writing came from the Adams letters; original letters are in a Boston library. The book was "manufactured" in 1920, but the book is static in regards to history and could be reprinted today as is. This is a wonderful trip down the founding and development of the US. Matching the events to your early history lessons in school will keep you awake if you let it. Reading this book is like eating the proverbial elephant-"one bite at a time." So take your time and enjoy.

Park and Plaza Report by Donn Weaver

Then month of April was busy in our Veterans Memorial Park and Plaza but that busy will not come close to what will happen in May!

THE PARK

Last month we had the American Legion 344 Auxiliary Easter Egg Hunt, Blessings of the Jeeps and a Medal of Honor Tribute fundraiser along with record breaking recreational traffic and playground action. Even more importantly, the county approved the final 50 percent drawings so infrastructure digging for electrical, irrigation pipes and more planting should be able to finally launch in May or June. In April, a new adult exercise area was built near the playground and foreshadows other workout stations that will be constructed along the park pathways. We ordered a Memorial Park bench in memory of JJ Justice, Past President of Rolling Thunder FL-1 and rededicated a bench outside the main door to honor a MIA hero whose remains were finally returned. His family member belongs to RTFL-1. Check it out, it is an amazing story.

May will see seven huge events as well as Scout campouts and

more improvements with several volunteer groups promising help. With the Amphitheater coming in 2024, "you ain't seen nothing yet."

THE PLAZA

The PACT Act

On August 10, 2022, President Biden signed into law the Sergeant First Class (SFC) Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022, also known as the PACT Act, into law. This Legislation brought about the following changes:

- Expands the lists of the locations, timeframes, and the presumptive conditions related to herbicides exposures.
- Removes the manifestation period and its compensable level requirement for certain disabilities occurring in Persian Gulf War Veterans.
- Expands locations for Persian Gulf War Veterans.
- Expands the list of presumptive conditions and timeframes for certain diseases associated with burn pits and toxic exposures.
- Expands the list of risk activities for radiation exposures.

Now it gets even better by letting you check up on your claim and see its status as it crawls through the VA system.

How Can I Check My PACT Act Claim Status?

Veterans, their families and/or their survivors who have filed claims under the new law that expanded VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, radiation and other toxic substances, known as the PACT Act, can now check the status of those claims. The VA is in the middle of an awareness campaign to ensure Veterans, their families, caregivers, or survivors know about the expanded care and benefits for Veterans affected by toxic exposure, and to encourage them to file a claim.

The PACT Act also added more health conditions that the VA now considers presumptive conditions. Which means the conditions were caused by exposure to those toxic substances. For instance, the VA has added two new Agent Orange presumptive conditions, High Blood Pressure, and Monoclonal Gammopathy of undetermined significance (MGUS is a non-cancerous condition where the body makes an abnormal protein, called a paraprotein.) Although MGUS is not a cancer, people

with it have a slightly higher risk of developing: myeloma (a cancer of blood cells called plasma cells) or lymphoma. However, most people with MGUS never develop a related cancer and do not need treatment.

The VA's awareness campaign is making it easier for beneficiaries to access VA benefits and services. Now you can easily check the status of those PACT Act claim once they have been submitted. Here is how:

- Sign into your va.gov account with your existing Login.gov, ID.me, DS Logon or My HealtheVet account. If you don't have any of these accounts, you can create a free Login.gov or ID.me account. Once you are signed into your account, simply follow these three steps to check the status of your PACT Act claim:
- Go to your "My VA" dashboard. You will find the link for this dashboard in the top right corner of the page once you're signed in.
- Scroll down to the "Track Claims" section.
 There, you'll see a summary of the latest status information for any open claims or appeals you may have.
- Click on the "View Status" button for a specific claim. You will go to a page with more details about that claim's status and supporting evidence. Evidence may include documents like a doctor's report or medical test results. (Claim status tool FAQs can be found here.)

What else can I learn about my PACT Act claim?

After you log in and follow the steps above, you can also find out:

- Where your claim, appeal or decision review is in the review process. (Learn what your claim status means here.)
- Which documents and/or forms the VA needs from you.
- Which documents have already been received from health care providers, government agencies and other sources.
- Details like your claim type, the date VA received your claim and the name of your representative.

What should I do if I need help filing a claim or have questions?

The Disabled American Veterans Service Officers are available to assist any Veteran or their survivor(s) in filing claims, reviewing information, or answering questions.


