Our guest speakers represent partnerships we have with Patrick Space Force Base and the Honor Flight Organization. The Navy League will hold their quarterly BBQ at the Port Ministry in Cape Canaveral to feed the crews on break from the Cruise Ships and any Merchant Marines that may be in port. We normally have five cruise ships in port and feed 300-400 individuals from all over the world.

Tossing the first sixteen-inch shell to open the European offensive and firing the last big naval bullet in the Pacific campaign – these are the outstanding mileposts in the 39-month fighting career of the U.S.S. Massachusetts.

When peace came to the Pacific in World War II, the U.S.S. Massachusetts had earned 11 Battle Stars and could look back on a long and action-packed career.

From the time of commissioning on May 12, 1942, until the end of the war in mid-August 1945, she had logged over 225,000 nautical miles, her journeying taking her all the way from Casablanca to Tokyo and the China coast.

# Veteran Community Supports NVHS to Help Veterans Urgent Need

he Cape Canaveral Radison was host to more than five hundred advocates on 06 October for a major fundraising event. Their unified mission: support the activities throughout the year of National Veterans Homeless Support (NVHS), Inc. NVHS is a Cocoa based 501(c)3 organization founded in 2008 by George Taylor, Sr., who was once himself a homeless veteran. The veteran-focued organization operates exclusively in Brevard County working with many partners and supporters to help their cause.

The October event raised many thousands of dollars through sponsors, dinner ticket prices, a silent auction and a live auction led by Sheriff Wayne Ivey. There were more than 140 veterans in attendance as the event opened with a role call with each stating their name and service. Several veteran groups sponsored tables at the event including MOAACC and the VMC affiliated Rolling Thunder FL-1. In a thankful gesture, every

sponsor contributing to the event was recognized throughout the evening.

NVHS strives to bring veterans and families out of homelessness and in assisting veterans and their families with rent, utilities, and other issues to prevent them from becoming homeless. They also tackle homelessness where it exists--on the streets of the community.

Each year NVHS recognizes the "NVHS Veteran Advocate of the Year." Donn Weaver of MOAACC, Veterans Memorial Center and other veteran organizations received the 2023 Award.

The organization is truly out doing good in the Brevard community. The evening featured the moving story of what NVHS has accomplished in Brevard County in 2023:

- Worked with over 100 veterans to find paths out of being homeless in 2023
- Drew down Veteran Homelessness from 1800 in 2008 to 65 before the pandemic and 200 today as the economy takes its toll
- Helped 419 veterans (and many families among this number) to AVOID being homeless in 2023
- Supported the Veterans Memorial Center and MOAACC Good Deeds Foundation to provide extensive services, clothes, medical support, etc. to 70 homeless vets in the January 2023 Stand Down to Stand Up

Their work is not completey, as there are an estimated 4,600 veterans living in poverty in Brevard and it is the mission of NVHS to keep these vets in their homes.

# Cape Canaveral Space Force Station Shuts Down South Gate Viewing Area

South Gate launch viewing area at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station as of Nov 1, 2023, citing concerns over public safety. The decision comes after multiple serious vehicle crashes in the vicinity and a dramatic increase in mission cadence, prompting leadership to take action to prevent any future incidents.

The decision to close the South Gate viewing area was not taken lightly. "The safety of the public is our utmost priority," said Brig. Gen. Kristin Panzenhagen, Space Launch Delta 45 commander. "Recent incidents highlighted an unacceptable level of risk to bystanders at the South Gate viewing area and to the continuity of our mission. While we understand the disappointment this closure may cause, we cannot compromise on safety."

As the closure takes effect, Space Launch Delta 45 encourages space enthusiasts to explore other safe viewing alternatives. Public viewing events at designated areas throughout Brevard County will continue to be available, allowing the community to experience the excitement of space missions while minimizing potential risks. For additional suggestions on where to watch launches go to Frequently Asked Questions about Launches.

While the South Gate viewing area's closure is disappointing, it underscores the importance of prioritizing safety in all aspects of space exploration. As technology advances and more ambitious missions are planned, ensuring the safety of the general public will remain a paramount concern for space agencies worldwide.

Space Launch Delta 45 is geographically located at both Patrick Space Force Base and Cape Canaveral Space Force Station, Florida. Space Launch Delta is

the World's Premier Gateway to Space and operates the Eastern Range and provides public safety and mission assurance for rocket launches from Cape Canaveral Space Force Station and NASA's Kennedy Space Center. ## Chaplain's Corner by Chaplain Chip Hanson USMC (Fmr)

Now that October and Halloween are over, the holiday season has begun. On Sunday 11-11-18 we have Veterans Day, on Thursday, November 23, 2023, is Thanksgiving Day.

This is supposed to be a happy time of the year, but there are many those who are serving overseas, many away from their families for the first time, and our seniors who are alone or forgotten living in nursing homes or worse. Our Military Veterans with TBI or PTSD suffer every day with their memories. The United States has 22 Veterans per day who commit suicide, or 8,030 annually.

According to the Pew Research Center, 96% of Veterans who have served post-9/11, are proud of their service; however, nearly half say that readjusting to civilian life was difficult, most often citing family issues. About one in six Veterans were

wounded in combat and slightly more than half experienced emotional trauma or distress while serving. Tragically, even with the positive, supportive culture we have, 84% of post-9/11 veterans feel like the public just doesn't understand the sacrifices made by them or their families. This touches on one truly hidden wound of war.

What can we do to possibly bring a little joy to these wonderful folks, whose only crime is to have or is serving our country, or growing old, or for those of us who are combat Veterans living with memories from a war?

All of us have our own way of trying to bring some light into life. I think sometimes just a word of encouragement is all it takes

In the words of SAM Clemmons (Mark Twain) "Whenever you find yourself on the side of the majority, it is time to reform—or pause and reflect."

Psalm 118:24 This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

# **Supporting the Space Coast Honor Flight**

n annual tradition that brings together local veteran support organizations in Brevard took place very early in the morning (0215 am) on October 14th. That was when the 75th Mission of the Space Coast Honor Flight (SCHF) held its pre-flight ceremony at Wickham Park.

As always, the focus was on 30 veterans as they prepared to travel to Washington, DC, to see their memorials and to be honored in many ways through a very long, but lifetime memory type day. Since 2010, 1948 veterans have taken this same trip over the course of 75 flights with SCHF. The SCHF organizations views their mission as is a unique opportunity to show our gratitude to these Heroes who made it possible for us to enjoy the freedoms we have today. The one-day all expenses paid trip they provide gives veterans an opportunity to visit their memorials and reflect on their service in company of fellow veterans.

The oldest veteran leaving for DC served in WWII and had his 100th birthday two months before. He joined two Korean War, 24 Vietnam War and three Cold/GWOT veterans. They visited the Navy, USAF, WW II, Korean War, Vietnam War Memorials and monuments along with Arlington National Cemetery, where one was chosen to lay the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

To enhance the experience each Veteran is paired with a Guardian escort and has a wheelchair available. For the third straight year the Good Deeds Foundation (GDF) of the Cape Canaveral Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America (MOAACC) provided RADM James Hart, President of the SCHF, a check for \$4000 to help with the airfare and expenses for another ten Guardians during 2024. Those Guardians come from two special organizations: ROTC College students at Florida Tech and military veterans who are undertaking PhD level training through a VA program at FIT. After graduation, they aspire to hold positions where they will support veterans. Thus, four organizations combined on one mission before 3 am that morning.

The 14 October flight included four Guardians from FIT and one previous Guardian, now defending her PhD dissertation, Delaney Bennett Granko. Granko attended the early morning meeting to help with the festivities, as the event holds a special place in her heart. Several years ago, fellow ROTC Cadet from the University of Florida, John Granko, proposed in Wash DC

### **Bricks, Benches and Trees**

A total of eight bricks were ordered in the month of October, with five bricks installed from previously open orders and those received in October. Three bricks (recent orders) remain in CSPRAY's work queue. Lastly, CSPRAY will be pressurewashing our memorial plaza in preparations for Veteran's Day. CSPRAY is doing an amazing job for our Center and our veteran families!

There is one open order for a tree and the associated memorial plate. Our vendor will be delivering the plate in November.

There is one open order for a memorial bench. The bench is slated for delivery by the end of November. It will be assembled no later than the first week of December, and placed on display in from of the museum until it is permanently placed in the park. Thank you in advance to the VMC's Maintenance Supervisor, Jerry Johnson.

Wayne Fried has completed the first review of all the brick orders the center has ever received. He has catalogued hundreds of bricks into a database and is researching a few questions regarding about sixty bricks. This data will eventually be placed in a kiosk where visitors will be able to electronically research and locate their specific memorial brick. This is an extremely tedious task requiring months of dedicated effort. Wayne Fried is to be commended for his dedication to this effort.

### The Amphitheater

The cost of the project has been received for the park improvements and the Amphitheater and we are in some final negotiations between the Merritt Island Redevelop Agency, the Parks and Recreation Department and the Lead Contractor, Ivey's Construction. All parties will have a series of meetings through the next month and hopefully have the groundbreaking and the start of construction soon.

What is BNOVLB? This organizaiton is a MOAACC Cape Canaveral Support Committee and a BVC/VMC initiative to locate and identify unclaimed cremated American veterans and inter them at the Cape Canaveral National Cemetery. The goal is to provide these forgotten heroes a proper service with honor and respect. Brevard County has many, many veterans who have been languishing on funeral home shelves and other locations, sometimes up to several years and for some, decades.

On Wednesday, November 15, 2023, at 1400 to 1530 hours, we will hold our inaugural service at the Flag Assembly Area of the Cape Canaveral National Cemetery. At this time, we will inter between 15 and 20 American veterans with full military honors. We will be looking for volunteers to carry urns and flags during this first service as well as other activities. About sixty volunteers will be needed.



## Leningrad by Anna Reid Book Report by Karen Croft, Catalog # WWIIEJ-19

This is an historical account of the two-and-a-half-year siege of Leningrad (now St. Petersburg), during WWII while the German Nazi forces surrounded the Soviet city. It was the beginning of Hitler's Operation Barbarossa, the largest military operation in history. Actual lives lost in Leningrad are estimated at 750,000 – most of which were the result of starvation.

The non-aggression agreement (Molotov-Ribbentrop Pact) signed by Stalin and Hitler in 1939 was obviously a useless document. Less than two years later, on June 22, 1941, an announcement made by Vyacheslav Molotov, the Commissar for Foreign Affairs, to the citizens of the Soviet Union that German troops had attacked their country. By September, the city was surrounded. The siege was as much the fault of Stalin as it was for Hitler. Read the book and find out all the fascinating details of this event!



## VA Disability Benefits Will Increase 3.2% in 2024

Veterans receiving VA disability compensation will see a 3.2% increase in their monthly checks in 2024.

This increase, which will go into effect in January, will apply to over 5.4 million veterans who receive VA disability benefits, as well as nearly half a million surviving spouses and dependents receiving Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC).

The increase is significantly lower than last year's historical jump of 8.7%, yet higher than in 2020 and 2021, when disability benefits increased less than 2%. Because of the Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2023, signed by President Biden on June 14, the VA COLA is equal to the one applied to Social Security benefits. This means with the announcement of a 3.2% raise in Social Security benefits, we now know there will be an equivalent 3.2% increase in VA disability benefits.

## 2024 VA Disability Compensation Payments

In the table on the right, the 2024 disability compensation rates for a veteran with no dependents is listed. Monthly compensation is higher for veterans with one or more dependents.

#### **CALCULATED AMOUNTS BASED ON 2023 VA COMPENSATION**

**RATES:** For spouses and children receiving DIC benefits, the new standard monthly payment is expected to increase from \$1,562.74 in 2023 to \$1.612.75 in 2024.

Monthly military pension payments are expected to increase by \$32 for every \$1,000 of retirement pension.

Veterans and surviving family members should see an increase in their monthly payments in their January 2024 payment. If you do not see a difference in the amount, contact the Veterans Benefits Administration.
