Activities and Events

The month of April was especially busy for me, as I had several events with some of the other organizations I support as part of my role as President of the VMC and Community relations. I attended the annual Shrimpfeast at the Port on April 5th as a member of the Propeller Club. The event was a fundraiser for Maritime scholarships for High School graduates. On the 6th of April, the Navy League and Propeller Club supported the Port Ministry by cooking for around 400 crew members from the five Cruise Ships that were in port. We do this on a quarterly basis. On April 13th I attended the Naval Ordnance Test Union (NOTU) Submarine Ball and loaned them our Klaxon from the WWII diesel submarine, USS Hardhead SS-365. Also on April 13th, I attended American Space Museum's Shuttlefest III, an annual celebration

of support to the NASA Space Shuttle Program. American Space Museum is a member of the Museums of Brevard (MOB) along with the VMC.

he VMC hosted the April 27th Brevard Parkinson's Alliance 5K walk/run fundraiser in the park. It began with a Running Zone sponsored 5K walk/run followed by an event with food trucks and vendors. Many of our personnel supported, as did the Sea Cadets and JROTC cadets to make it a successful event. 
We have an election coming up so step up into a leadership position, board position or committee chairperson. We need you!

Two New Veteran Interviews

The library interviewed two veterans from the Vietnam era in April Ben Bydalek and Beverly Sangeleer.

Ben Bydalek Served in the USMC from March 1966 to March 1968. He was assigned to Delta Battery 2nd Battalion 11th Marines 1st Marine Division. Ben's artillery battery took part in multiple combat operations in Vietnam and earned him a Purple Heart, Combat Operations Ribbon, and Presidential Unit Citation. Beverly Sangeleer served in the Navy Nurse Corps during the Vietnam War. Completed OCS at Newport R. I. and and commissioned as a Lieutenant J.G. A brief history on Memorial's Day

Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States, for remembering 1,498,240 men and women who died, and 40,031 still missing in action, while serving in our Country's Armed Forces. The holiday, which is currently observed every year on the last Monday of May, this year, will be held on May 24, 2020. The holiday was originally held on May 30 and marks the unofficial start of the summer season.

Memorial Day is not to be confused with Veterans Day – Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving, whereas Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans Army, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard, Air Force and now the Space Force.

Merchant Marines are not a part of our Military. That is why they are not recognized on a Veteran holiday. (ref CITREP, Wikipedia, and several other publications).

In 1868, General John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans founded in Decatur, Illinois, established Decoration Day as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the Union war dead with flowers. By the 20th century, various Union and Confederate memorial traditions, celebrated on different days, merged, and Memorial Day eventually extended to honor all Americans who died while in military service.

In 1915, following the Second Battle of Ypres, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, a physician with the Canadian Expeditionary Force, wrote the poem, "In Flanders Fields". Its opening lines refer to the fields of poppies that grew among the soldiers' graves in Flanders.

In 1918, inspired by the poem, YWCA worker Moina Michael attended a YWCA Overseas War Secretaries' conference wearing a silk poppy pinned to her coat and distributed over two dozen more to others present. In 1920, the National American Legion adopted it as their official symbol of remembrance

On May 26, 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson designated an "official" birthplace of the holiday by signing the presidential proclamation naming Waterloo, New York, as the holder of the title. This action followed House Concurrent Resolution 587, in which the 89th Congress had officially recognized that the patriotic tradition of observing Memorial Day had begun one hundred years prior in Waterloo, New York. The village credits druggist Henry C. Welles and county clerk John B. Murray as the founders of the holiday. Snopes and Live Science discredit the Waterloo account.

Hello Membership,

Let's stand against veteran suicide. I want to challenge you!



The Fire Watch is Florida's fight to end veteran suicide. They are building a life-saving network of community members and organizations trained to identify the warning signs of veterans in crisis and to direct those veterans to the help they need.

Many organizations have become a Veteran Safe Place (VSP) but not the Brevard Veterans Memorial Center (BVMC). We have 12 Watch Standers but require 50 for the "VSP" designation.

I would like to challenge the over 400 BVMC members to let us know that they are trained as Watch Standers or ask you to get trained!

I reached out to Henry Angulo, Regional Programs Director (South FL) and partner of the BVMC, and he provided the following guidance:

- "I know it can be challenging to schedule a time and date for members to have the training in person. So, our online training may be the better option.
- We just need the members to complete the training online to add "Brevard Veterans Memorial Center" as their "Organization" when they submit their information.
- They can also provide you a picture or copy of their certificate once completed to you and we can count them.

Any individual can become a Watch Stander by completing our online training at https://www.thefirewatch.org/watch-standers. The training consists of watching 2 to 3 short videos, familiarizing yourself with our resource guide and signing a pledge.

Courageous Division Sea Cadets

The next month – May, is shaping up to be very busy! It starts with a set of standard drills on Saturday, May 4th at our VMC headquarters. The next day, on Sunday, May 5th, we will provide support during the "Back Brevard Heroes" BBQ. Two weeks later, on May 18th, we will drill once again at NOTU on CCSFB. During these drills, we will have our final practice for our "program" for our annual "Courageous Division Awards & Graduation" ceremony which will take place the very next day (i.e. Sunday, May 19th). Please note that there will be two Cadets graduating from our program. One of the graduates - Cadet Chief Chapin, has been one of our best Cadets ever – we hate to see her go! However, we anticipate her providing strong leadership in whatever path she decides to embark!



VMC Hosts Record Setting Fundraiser for Brevard Parkinson's Alliance

On a beautiful if windy day on April 27, the Veterans Memorial Center and Park, as well as parts of the Merritt Island Mall, was the scene of a very special event. For the fourth time the Brevard Parkinson's Alliance (BPA) staged their annual 5K Race, 1K Walk and fundraiser at the VMC. The results were amazing.

More than 200 runners participated in the 5K along with 80 walkers for the 1K. BPA had 70 volunteers; more than 20 sponsors and vendors which brought in more than \$15K; and 15 Cocoa HS JROTC Cadets gave up their Saturday morning to make sure runners made the correct turns. The race winner set a new record of just under 20 mins!!! It was truly a fun and heart-warming day with the goal of helping more than 5,000 Brevard residents living with Parkinson's as well as adding to research funding. President Barbara Fradkin and her BPA team did a great job and Running Zone also made it a smooth event with set up starting at 0600 am. At least 500 people were around as runners, helpers, watchers and supporters for the cause.

Education & Citizenship Armed Forces Coalition of the Space Coast (ECAC)

After months of planning, a new project in Brevard launched on 15 Feb 2024. It is the Education & Citizenship Armed Forces Coalition of the Space Coast (ECAC). The group will eventually include leaders and key contacts from all schools, public, private, and home school at all grade levels; DoD military education outreach units; DoD contractors; STEM focused program leaders; many veteran organizations and other groups that sponsor scholarships and other youth programs; and more. The program is set to fully launch in August when the new 2024-25 school year begins. A Museum attendance and service hours program is set to begin in June 2024.

The ECAC has three goals:

- 1. Steer students toward over 23 Brevard County Museums to both visit for credit and perform service hours.
- 2. Engage veteran and civic groups to provide details of their student scholarships, competitions, awards, STEM programs, and military track training from ROTC, Academies and more. These opportunities including names, description & eligibility, and website link (for easy access to details) will be compiled in a list & populated on the Brevard Public Schools' website.
- 3. Expand opportunities for STEM related learning through new programs in the Brevard Public Schools and all schools. For

example, an outreach STEM program at PSFB and organizational STEM programs like the Civil Air Patrol, Fleet Reserve at Titusville HS and AFA's CyberPatriot and StellarXplorers.

These tools will equip all guidance counsellors and teachers in all schools - including home schools - with the tools to encourage a wider range of participation from students.

Ensuring a Legacy at Veterans Memorial Center

Last summer 19-year-old Merritt Island High School graduate, Christian Bellmore, died in the US as a result of military service. He had completed basic and advanced training and was awaiting more training and possible PCS deployment. Last Fall the Veterans Memorial Center hosted a celebration of life with over 100 attending, many of whom were friends of Airman Bellmore. Leading

the family was his mother, US Army SFC Samantha Mecke, who has been in the Army for 17 years and is currently assigned to Fort Liberty in North Carolina. Merritt Island was her home and when she was often deployed, Airman Bellmore stayed in Merritt Island and lived with his grandmother.

After the service we worked with SFC Mecke to help her make sure her only son's legacy would forever be preserved on Merritt Island. Earlier this month a Memorial Bench was received and assembled. It will go along with a Memorial Brick in the USAF Plaza section and Memorial Tree, which will be planted when the VMC Park is upgraded. VMC also took steps to add the Airman's name to the American Legion sponsored bench just inside the Plaza Gate.

Book Report


"Patrick Air Force Base" by Roger McCormick

Patrick Air Force Base has a long history dating back to World War II when it was established as the Banana River Naval Air Station (BRNAS). Authorized by the Naval Expansion act of 1938 BRNAS was commissioned on October 1, 1940, and served as an adjunct to the Jacksonville Naval Air Station. PBM Mariner and PBY Catalina Seaplanes were initially flown on anti-submarine patrols along Florida's east coast. The Banana River was used for taking off and landing. The OS2U Kingfisher, another smaller float plane, was also used for search and rescue missions at the new Naval Base.

Following WWII a long-range proving ground for guided missiles was needed by all the US military services. BRNAS along with Cape Canaveral as a launch site was selected as the best location after trying Baja California and Arizona.

The Joint Long-Range Proving Ground was established in 1949 by the US Air Force. Patrick Air Force Base was named after Major General Mason Mathews Patrick. A graduate of West Point, General Patrick was an avid military pilot and early adopter of our Air Service in 1923. The Missile test range was named after General Patrick on August 1, 1950. Many photos of missile development and testing along the extensive Eastern Test Range are included in this book.

Disabled American Veterans (DAV), Space Coast Chapter 123, Inc.

Meet Your Service Officer John (Jack) Donohue



John (Jack) Donohue: Born 28 January in Brooklyn, New York where I was raised, went to grade school, and 1st year of high school. I finished high school at Mount Saint Joseph's in Baltimore, MD in June of 1955 and volunteered for the draft into the U. S. Army in March 1956. I went to Fort Carson, CO and became part of B Battery, 28th Field Artillery, Battalion, 8th Infantry Division for basic and artillery training before shipping to Germany in Operation Gyroscope in September. In November, I transferred to B Battery, 264th Field Artillery Battalion (Atomic) and separated to the USAR in February of 1958.

In June of 1960, I married my teenage sweetheart, Joan, and this year will mark our 64th anniversary. Then in August 1960, I was appointed to the Fire Department of New York (FDNY) and served just under 21 years before retiring as Captain. While in the FDNY, in 1973, a friend told me that the USCG was looking for prior service military personnel who were experienced police and firefighters to fill the Coast Guard's new task of port security. I joined and 24 years later, I retired as PSS3 (W-3).



After leaving the FDNY, I was awarded a scholarship to Pace University and graduated in 1984 with a degree in Public Accounting. I worked for Vulcan Installation as bookkeeper, comptroller and finally as CFO before

leaving in 1993. I realized that I didn't want to be an accountant anymore and that I would rather do something to help people more directly. I started working for Federation Employment and Guidance Services, a private health care agency that operated group homes, employment training centers, half-way houses and total care facilities for adults with all degrees of mental health issues. As Director of Safety and Security, I got to see, in my opinion, some of the most dedicated health care professionals imaginable. I retired in 2005 and in 2008 my wife and I moved to IRCC in Viera.

I joined the DAV in Merritt Island in 2012 and became a Certified Service Officer in 2013. Since then, I have served more than 3000 volunteer hours in Space Coast Chapter 123. In addition to being a Service Officer, I also serve as the Treasurer for the Chapter.

"That's Not My Job"

Camp LeJeune Toxic Water Claims Will "Sunset" This Coming August

The time window to file a Camp LeJeune Toxic Water claims will close on August 10, 2024.

The good news for those who have already filed claims is litigation moving more quickly. Track 1 discovery depositions (individuals who allege they have contracted bladder cancer, kidney cancer, leukemia, Parkinson's disease, or non-Hodgkin's lymphomas) have begun, and the trial could be as early as May. In a ruling February 6, the court determined that victims could not have their cases heard by a jury and all trials will be heard by a federal judge.

CLJA does not list specific covered diseases. Anyone could sue if they resided, worked, or were exposed to water at Camp LeJeune for at least 30 days between 1953 and 1987. And that exposure caused them harm.

Some law firms are drawing the line on what claims they will file as a U.S. government agency study concluded certain diseases are more close associated with Camp LeJeune exposure.

Many veterans are concerned about should they file a claim under the CLJA will that put their VA benefits at risk. The VA has plainly stated in is official guidance that" ...if you awarded relief from a CLJA lawsuit, your VA benefits will not be reduced, and your eligibility for other VA benefits will not be affected." If a veteran is already receiving benefits or

other compensation for injuries caused by the water at Camp Lejeune, the act still gives them the right to sue; and the benefits will not be lost even if action is brought under the act.

However, it is important for veterans to understand what is at stake with disability benefits and take pause before filing a lawsuit or joining a class action. If a veteran receives compensation from a lawsuit, the Justice Department will consult with the VA to "offset" any lawsuit compensation a veteran has already received (or is receiving) from the VA for the same disabilities. The government will not allow you to be compensated twice for the same purpose.

With the August 10th "Sunset" deadline fast approaching, if you are inclined to file a lawsuit, you are encouraged to file that administrative claim as quickly as possible. Your condition does not have to be on the VA presumptive list or the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry to file a claim. Surviving family members may pursue claims on behalf of deceased loved ones.
